Qualitative analysis of Criterion 1

The College is affiliated to HemchandYadav University, Durgand it follows the curriculum designed by the University, and curricular activities are strictly aligned with the University's academic calendar. But the curriculum implementation is supplemented with the preparation of lesson plan, completion of syllabus in time, industrial visits with the accompaniment of teachers, guided internship, project work, and adoption of a comprehensive Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) system. The academic activities are being carried out as per time table and academic calendar approved in the beginning of the session. Continuous monitoring is done by Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The college has a central library. The compulsory summer internship which has a viva voce examination is organized to give first-hand practical exposure to students in their area of specialization. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) ensures that all the processes are adhered to. The faculty members are encouraged to update their subject knowledge by attending seminars, and Faculty Development Programmes (FDP). The College believes in the holistic development of each student, and therefore it tries to maintain a perfect balance between curricular, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities. College observesvarious days like World Environment day, Hariyar Bemetara, plantation drive water conservation drive etc. College organizes Poster, Slogan, Model Competitionand street show (Nukkad-natak) for awareness on environment related issues. The college has installed their own solar plant of 100kw to protect and preserve natural resources. Faculty members to use Information and communication technology (ICT) tools to make the teaching-learning process effective. The time-table includes slots for core papers, elective papers and soft skills. Mentor system is effective. Feedback is collected from the students, teachers, alumni, employers, parents, and the non teaching staff for their evaluations and suggestions. The college has nineteen MOUs and linkages with external academic, financial, industrial and culturalinstitutions. Students Clubs such as Sports, NSS, Cultural are in existence.

The College is very keen on the learning process of the students admitted in various courses in entire academic program. The College Academic Monitoring Committee ensures the time-bound, smooth and transparent implementation of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE). CIE has different components such as internal examinations, assignments, attendance, seminar and viva voce, with fixed weightage to each component. The college conducts value added programmes apart from the university syllabus. Teachers are encouraged to use blended mode of teaching and learning methods with use of modern technology aids such as video conference, YouTube, PPTs, invited talks, field visits and assignments. Group activities like group discussion, field work, guided discovery role play excursions, project preparation, etc. are undertaken so as to strengthen the knowledge base of the students and also to contribute to skill development. The college also encourages self learning and peer group learning. The college adopts certain measures for each students group. One compulsory period of Chetna Vikas Mulya Shiksha is conducted regularly in B.Ed. Along with this, two ChetnaVikas Mulya Shiksha workshop of seven days(yearly) are also conducted in the college for all students. B.Ed students go to nearby village & collect dataregarding the expenses on education, drugs of the village and present program in the village for awareness of all these facts. They also present the solution through cultural programs (mangal maitri programme) which is organized in adopted village 'kiritpur' every year. The library book bank and knowledge drove schemes such as N-List, EG-software has been introduced by the institution, for student, staff and Guest. For advanced learner are provided more reference books based on their performance and recommendation by the heads of various departments. It implements mentoring system. Some new skill and personality development courses have been introduced in the college to acquaint the students with practical knowledge outside classroom teachings. A Few number of teachers are with Ph.D. and A few numbers of faculties are UGC NET qualifications.

The institution has conducted several workshops, and seminars on Research issues and entrepreneurship during the last 5 years. The college has received total 2.5 lakh grants from Government and non-governmental agencies for research and infrastructure. College has two research guide also and seven research scholars. Two faculty members are pursuing P.hd in management and hindi. Very few research papers are published in Journals, Conference proceedings, Books and in edited volumes/books by the faculty members. The college has an Extension Activity Cell under IOAC which engages its staff and students in the development of neighbourhood areas and in community development service. The students of the college has initiatives for voter awareness program in the neighbouring villages. They have conducted around 26 workshops to promote and transfer the knowledge through Various Departments, Forums, Cells has organizes different programmes for social awareness in nearby villages. The NSS unit actively organizes extension activities. Think India Education Award 2015 has recognized Samadhan College Bemetara as The Best Infrastructure Award at Rungta International School Raipur on 9th Feb 2015. The college has signed MoU with various organizations. However, the college needs to evolve mechanisms for getting more funds from central and state Govt. agencies to boost research and development activities in the college. They further need to strengthen their association with reputed academic institutions and bodies for collaborative research and faculty exchange programmes. Bhavya Srishti Udyog, Sericulture (M/S Kasare vanya silk mills)etc. have helped the students to developnecessary skills & develop innovative projects in various domains to promoteknowledge driven and technology based start up. College offers free computer, spoken English, careerguidance& personality development classes to school students of nearby villages with free transport facility. Faculty should be encouraged to participate and organise theme based workshops/seminars/conferences for generation of ideas and higher exposure. Students are taken on educational tours every year. Faculty should be motivated to be well connected with local area problems and people to find out solutions. They need to re-orient their research priorities accordingly. The students and staff members of the college are doing soil testing without any cost for welfare of the farmers in the neighbouring villages. There were three university toppers in BCA achieving 3rd, 5th and 6th rank in 2020. One of the student has got first rank in Bed Exam in the Bemetra Dist. In 2021 at university level.

There are spacious class rooms with proper infrastructure in the college. Main building of the college consists of Administrative office, Principal's office, IQAC office and the library, Examination Cell, 11 number of Classroom with LCD Projector.. The institution has computers for students and staff with latestconfiguration. The library includes reading room, reference sections, digital room and the librarian chamber. For security and safety, the college has fixed up boundary walls and bamboo fencing in all sides along with CCTV camera provision in different places of the main building. The library has a good number of text books, reference books, NCERT journals and magazines. The digital rooms are given essential facilities like electrical power supply with Battery backup, LCD projectors, furniture, anti-virus etc. College has 02 computer labs, one Computer Center withstate of the art well equipped in all respects to cater the technological needs of students. All the computer systems are Internet enabled. The college has 76 computers and 02 laptops, 04 printers with access to internet that are updated with latest versions of essential software. The Wi-Fi facility is provided to all over the campus in free of cost. The College has many computing equipments installed in the laboratories and other administrative places. It has two 100 Mbps broadband internet line service. The Physical & Infrastructural Facilities includes required Land, Administrative Offices, Public Announcement Systems, Smart Screens, IP based CCTV surveillance, Girls Hostel (Outside Campus with MOU), Indoor & Outdoor Sports facilities, hygienic canteen, vehicle parking area etc. Sports includesFootball, Basketball, Volleyball, Chess, and Badminton. The campus has plated with medicinal plants with scan codes. The biometric attendance for both students and staff members is seen. The college has three numbers of water purifiers . the college support facility includes Multipurpose hall, seminar hall, Compose pit, Lawn, girls common room with sanitary napkin machine and sanitary napkin incinerator facility, boys common room, media room, yoga room, sports room, primary health centre, store room, skill and innovation room, Psychology lab, music room and cover parking.

Extensive student support system is available in the institution. It commences with the induction and orientation programme. The students are admitted in UG Program, B Ed and PG diploma programmes as per policy and guidelines of State Govt. and university. The admissions are made on-line. Reservation in admissions is as per State Govt. policy. Orientation and counselling sessions are organized to make students aware of rules and regulations of the college. Examination system and other facilities like sports, books etc being provided. The vision, mission and objective of the college is explained to the students and staff. Sessions to orient students to acquaint them with the vision and mission of the college as well as facilities and amenities are being conducted throughout the year. The course guidelines, outcomes, methodologies to be followed are also being explained. College has made efforts to leverage ICT for accountability and transparency in the systems. Scholarships and free ships are made available as per Govt. schemes. Counselling is provided by competent counsellors. Institute mentorship programs and Tutor system is available in the campus. Special sessions on stress and anxiety control are an added advantage. The language lab helps them improve communication. Around 67 percentage students got some certain amount as scholarship by government. Placement opportunity is provided to all the eligible students of the college by the placement cell. Around 6 percentage of students are placed during the last 5 years through campus recruitment. Around 74 percentage of students are qualified in state/national/international levelexaminations and around 118 number students are pursuing higher education during the last five years. The Student Council, a nominated body, is constituted every year to execute the active participation of students in academic cultural, social, and extension activities. The College Alumni Association is registeredand the connectivity with noted alumni as members. Financial contribution of the alumni for the last five years is Rs. 3 lakh. . Mentorship and tutorship programmes are in operations but need to be strengthened. Faculty and students feedback mechanisms are available but needs further improvement.

The governance of the institution is reflective of leadership in tune with the vision and mission of the Institution. The Principal being the executive head of the institution is also the leader for all academic and administrative process with well defined set of responsibilities. The institution practices one decentralised and participative. Principal has delegated the power to mobilize the resources from the various authorities. Delegation of work to all HoDs, association cells and committees is observed. The Institute motivates to undertake research projects, consultancy activities, publish papers in journal and at conferences. Though the Institute claims to have perspective plan in research and development activities, significant improvement is awaited. Governing body and financial committee exist. Service rules, promotional policies, recruitment policies should improved. Governing body takes all decisions. No interference of management is found. However, effectiveness of bodies can not be interpreted without quantitative data. For faculty empowerment effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staff for their development are mentioned. For the welfare of the staff EPF of india benefit scheme is provided in which 12% of the salary is contributed by each staff member and corresponding amount is contributed by the management. .The college has adopted selfappraisal system to evaluate the performance of the faculty. Areas of improvements of teachers are collected through student feedback. Non teaching staff members are assessed through the Annual Performance Appraisal Report (APAR) forms which contains brief description of duties undertaken by the employee and its timely accomplishment, which is finally checked by the next higher authority. The financial management of the institution is taken care by internal and external audit. Independent auditing firm conducts the regular audit. The college follows self-appraisal system to evaluate the performance of the faculty. Areas of improvements for teachers are collected through students feedback. Feedback system for non-teaching staff should be established. Though IQAC is functional, still needs further improvement.
